

THE HISTORY

Before evolving into the vibrant neighborhood we recognize today, the ARTS DISTRICT was home to hundreds of acres of grape vineyards. In the 1800's French grape varietals were grown throughout the area, making the Arts District the center of CA wine production. The vineyards gave way to citrus groves, which then gave way to railroads, manufacturing and trucking. As companies left the area to build larger factories in nearby cities, the area's buildings sat vacant and became dilapidated. In the 1970s, artists breathed new life into the neighborhood as galleries, cafes, artist bars and music and theatre venues popped up. In 1981, the Artist in Residence ordinance was established, allowing artists to live in industrial buildings. Raves and parties ensued. Bands, particularly in the punk genre, cut their teeth in the area. In the 1990s, the City of Los Angeles officially named the area "ARTS DISTRICT.". The 2010's brought a wave of new development, bringing an influx of people seeking an urban core with an authentic character to create, discover, eat & drink, experience and spend their money. With its distinguishable aesthetic, it's no surprise we constantly see the ARTS DISTRICT as a backdrop in print ads and on screen in commercials, shows and film.



Today we are amidst the next wave of residential, retail and office development, blending the area's industrial roots with creativity in everything from technology, architecture and entertainment to restaurants, breweries and lifestyle service providers and retailers.

THE ARTS DISTRICT is a fiercely original, urban neighborhood with streets rich in character and with building walls showcasing local artists. With an authenticity from the 20th century warehouses and former factories, organizations and residents are flocking to the neighborhood.

Over the last 2 years, over 1M sq ft has been leased to notable tech, fashion and entertainment employers adding nearly 4,000 employees to the area. In the adjacent downtown Los Angeles area, it is estimated over 500,000 workers are employed in the area with only 60,000 living Downtown. In the last 5 years, there have been nearly 2,800 residential units delivered in the area bringing the neighborhood to life through the architecture, the buildings and the people.

OZ BENEFIT

Spurring the growth of the **ARTS DISTRICT** is the underlying Opportunity Zone (OZ) designation to which many local entrepreneurs are utilizing unique advantages. For Qualified Businesses that are located in a Qualified Property (AVA Arts District is this designation), their investors are able to obtain tax benefits on capital gains invested into the qualified opportunity fund. As such the **ARTS DISTRICT** has a unique attraction for founders, start-ups, HQ relocations and entrepreneurs alike (Qualified Businesses) to establish businesses in the area to capitalize on the OZ benefits as their companies grow.

DEFINITIONS


- Qualified opportunity fund ("Qualified Fund"): an investment vehicle that has at least 90% of its assets as qualified opportunity zone property ("Qualified Property"). AVA Arts District is designated in the zone.
- Qualified Property: tangible property and/or equity interests in a US company engaged in a qualified opportunity zone business ("Qualified Business").
- Qualified Business: defined as (i) 70% of the company's tangible property must be in an OZ, (ii) 40% of a company's intangible property must be used in the active conduct of a business in an OZ, and (iii) 50% of a company's gross income must be derived from the active conduct of a business in an OZ.
